University and research organizations in Europe and North-America used to proudly display their institutional cooperation with the People's Republic of China (PRC). But sentiments have shifted dramatically, and the same institutions and individuals are more at risk of being labelled naïve, for upholding strong ties to China. In the US debate, security issues play a large role in rethinking academic partnerships, but European institutions are mainly concerned by threats to academic freedom. What kind of evidence do actors in academia and in science politics possess to evaluate the risks and opportunities of an engagement with partners in the PRC? In this roundtable discussion, we will explore these developments and questions with the expertise and first-hand insights from four renowned scholars.
